

Parent Reminders

Students are to safeguard their pin number, as individual pins are issued to each student and must not be used by any other student under Federal Regulation.

In each case of a stolen or misused pin number, the parent/guardian will be required to meet with the cafeteria manager to assist in resolving the problem.

During student meal service, no outside food service (e.g., McDonald's, Burger King, Taco Bell, etc.; packaged snacks such as hot Cheetos, etc.) are allowed in the cafeteria. Sack lunches are permitted. Milk can be purchased to go with sack lunches for \$.25 cash. Fruit juice is encouraged for sack lunches if the student is not buying milk.

Soda pop or other carbonated drinks are not allowed with either school meals or sack lunches.

Payment Methods for Meals

There are several ways to pay for your child's meals. Parents may send money with their child in the form of cash, check (\$20.00 returned check fee) or money order to be paid directly to the cafeteria. Payment may also be made online at <https://family.titank12.com/6TR85Q> using Visa, MasterCard or Discover (a transaction fee of \$2.60 will be applied to online payments). Parents/guardians may contact the school cafeteria at any time during business hours or use <https://family.titank12.com/6TR85Q> free of charge 24 hours per day to check the balance of your child's account and/or to view daily meal transactions. You may also set up a free email reminder for low balances online; the website will work with any mobile device web browser as well.

Complete Your 2019-2020 Meal Applications Now!

Meal Applications Are Now Available Online!

Great news...parents can now complete the Free and Reduced-price Meal Applications online beginning July 1, 2019. Don't delay, get your approval before school begins! Simply visit <https://family.titank12.com/6TR85Q> from any computer or mobile device, and click on "Apply Today" to get started. The online application is available in English and in Spanish. If you need assistance or do not have a computer or mobile device to complete the application online, visit your local school office for assistance. Paper applications may also be requested from your school cafeteria. Only one online application needs to be completed per family. Students receiving free or reduced meals last year will continue to receive these services at the beginning of the school year for the first 30 days. To continue receiving these services, a new application must be completed and approved. **Those students who were not receiving free or reduced price meals last year in the Alhambra District will need to pay the regular student cost until the application is approved, starting the first day of school, August 8, 2019.** A student's reduced-price lunch will cost \$.40, and a full-price lunch will cost \$2.40.

Rules of School Bus Safety

The safety of students is a top priority in the Alhambra School District. As the streets in Phoenix become more congested and heavily traveled, it increases the risk of children being injured on their way to and from school. If you walk to school, be sure to observe all traffic laws, and please use sidewalks and crosswalks whenever possible. Although statistics show that riding in a school bus is 2,000 times safer than riding in the family car, accidents around school buses claim the lives of a few children every year. To address these concerns, the Alhambra School District prepared a list of some basic safety precautions that will help ensure student safety at the bus stop, as well as on the school bus. Please take a few minutes to review this important information with your children. Together, we can assure a safe bus riding experience by teaching them to be responsible riders.



- Arrive at the bus stop five minutes early.
- Wait for the bus in a safe place in an orderly manner.
- Get on the bus in a single file line. Never push.
- Bus driver's instructions and directions will be obeyed at all times.
- Bus aisles will remain clear of all objects.
- Remain properly seated at all times.
- Keep your hands to yourselves at all times.
- Students may talk quietly or in normal conversational voice.
- Keep everything inside the bus.
- Glass containers, live animals or insects, and extremely large objects are prohibited.
