## MEDICINES / ADMINISTERING MEDICINES TO STUDENTS

## REQUEST FOR GIVING MEDICATION AT SCHOOL

## **Medications**

Under certain circumstances, when it is necessary for a student to receive prescription medication during school hours, District personnel may cooperate with the family physician and the parents if the following requirements are met:

- The medication must be prescribed by the physician.
- There must be a written order from the physician stating the name of the medication, the dosage, and the time it is to be given.
- There must be written permission from the parents to administer the medication to the child (see form below).
- The medication must be brought to the school office by a parent, guardian, or other designated adult in the properly labeled prescription bottle.
- A signed physician's statement indicating the necessity must accompany any request for self-administration of medicine, whether it is prescription or over-the-counter medicine except in the case of medication for diagnosed anaphylaxis and breathing disorders requiring hand-held inhaler devices. In these cases the student's name on the prescription label is sufficient for the physician's recommendation.
